Summer Sermon Series 1: More Than Meets the Eye

In nature, things are not always what they appear to be. The graphite in a pencil is hardly as valuable as a diamond, but graphite and diamonds are simply different forms of the same element: carbon. It can be difficult to see the deeper substance without closer examination. For Christians, it is necessary to carefully examine our surroundings to perceive how God might be showing up in them. Power, faith, transformation, and salvation often appear in ways we do not expect. God's work is radical, unusual, and often surprising, working behind the scenes and beneath the surface. This series, drawn from Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth, focuses on the various ways that members of the Christian community are called to look closely at where, when, and how God works beyond our expectations.
